Changes to Our Lunch Recess Schedule For 2016-2017

Welcome Back!!

Southwood School is excited to introduce a number of new features this upcoming school year which include the construction of our nature playground, the newly updated MakerSpace, and our school-wide house system. We are also excited about our new recess schedule. Feedback from students, parents, and staff has encouraged us to examine our lunch period and noon recess procedures. With our growing enrollment, behaviour issues, supervision, and our student's accessibility to playground equipment has become a concern. For this reason, we are moving to a split noon hour schedule.

Grades 1 and 3 students will follow the same schedule as last year. They will eat their lunch starting at 12:00 pm followed by their noon recess break from 12:25 to 12:50 pm. The schedule for grades 2 and 4 will be flipped. At 12:00 pm these students will proceed outside for their noon recess break. From 12:25 to 12:50 pm, these students will go to their designated lunch areas. We should also note that traditionally our kindergarten classes only started going out for recess after spring break in March. This year we plan on having them make this transition earlier in October as we recognize the benefits of this play time.

We recognize that recess serves as a necessary break from the rigors of concentrated, academic challenges in the classroom. But equally important is the fact that safe and well-supervised recess offers cognitive, social, emotional, and physical benefits that students also need. We trust this change in schedule will address some of the concerns brought to our attention.

School Routines

Remember to "sign in" When you enter the school you will see a sign that welcomes you to Southwood School! This sign reminds all visitors to report directly to the office and that parents need to stop at the office. The secretary will provide the necessary assistance.



All visitors, including parents, must sign in at the office. This allows the school to be aware of all adults in our building for safety and educational purposes.

Identification labels will be provided to all volunteers, substitute teachers, substitute educational assistants and Hanover School Division personnel that work in our school. These are to be picked up in the office when signing in.

When you are picking up or dropping off your child at the end of the day it would be best to arrange a pickup/drop off that is outside and near an entrance to the school. This will help reduce the crowding in the halls by the classroom doors at dismissal time (**3:45 p.m.**)

If a friend or relative is picking up a child from school the parent/guardian needs to notify the school or classroom teacher.

Parking near and around our school:

Obey the "**loading zone only**" areas of our streets that are marked out by yellow paint on the curbs. Parking is available behind the cross walk on 3rd street and past Barkman Ave. It is best to park on 3rd and 2nd streets, or further down Barkman Avenue. **Please DO NOT park, pick up or drop off your students in the bus lane or in the staff parking lot.** Double parking on Barkman Ave. or on 3rd Street poses a serious risk for everyone. There are many students that are walking along these sidewalks and streets at the end of the day, we appreciate the extra care parents are taking as they drive their children to and from school and watching out for other students. It is important for you to establish a routine with your child to be picked up either along 3rd Street or at the front of the school on Barkman Ave. as you wait for your child in the car. This should allow for the traffic to flow quickly and safely at pick up and dismissal time.



Custodial arrangements:

If you have a situation where parenting arrangements are unique and specific you need to inform the office and classroom teacher about these arrangements. Schools are required to follow legal documents that describe Custodial arrangements.

Leaving Messages

Keep this in mind when you are leaving a message for your child...

- Call or email the school as early as possible to leave a message (the end of the day is very busy in the office)
- Keep the message simple
- As much as possible make arrangements for your child the day before and send a note in the agenda

Strong Connections - September 16 & 19

Strong Connections is an assessment and relationship building program designed to enhance the beginning-of-the-year connection, assessment and familiarity of each student. These activities are not tests. It is a day to help us get to know our students from a variety of perspectives. The format for *Strong Connections* also provides an opportunity for teachers to extend and consolidate their understanding of each child through one-on-one interview/assessment times, and hopefully, help build a strong foundation for a positive relationship between the child and the teacher.

Approximately 230 out of Southwood's 460 students **will attend school only one of these two days.**

Please understand that your family will NOT be at school either Friday or Monday.

Parents will be notified early next week as to which day their children are to attend; if you have more than one child, all of your children will attend on the same day.

Religious Exercises and Religious Instruction at Southwood

Notice - Religious Exercises - Southwood School, 2016-2017

The Board of Trustees of the Hanover School Division has received petitions requesting that religious exercises be held in Southwood School during the 2016-2017 school year.

The petitioners have specified their desire for the recitation of the Lord's Prayer and the reading of a Bible passage or story from the Bible.

As the petitions bear the signatures of parents representing more than 60 students in the school, the Board of Trustees of the Hanover School Division has authorized religious exercises, as specified above, to be held before the official instructional day, from 9:00 a.m. to 9:05 a.m., in a designated common area of the school.

Provincial and divisional guidelines will be followed. These guidelines are available from the school office, the divisional administration offices, or on the web site at www.hsd.ca.

Only children of parents who have signed or joined the petition may participate. Parents may join the petition by forwarding a signed note to the Board of Trustees of the Hanover School Division (forward to Southwood School), indicating the name and the grade of the students they are signing for.

Notice - Religious Instruction - Southwood School, 2016-2017

The Board of Trustees of the Hanover School Division has received petitions requesting that religious instruction be held in Southwood School during the 2016-2017 school year.

The petitioners have specified their desire for the Discovery Time program offered by Child Evangelism Fellowship.

As the petitions bear the signatures of parents representing more than 25 students in the school, the Board of Trustees of the Hanover School Division has passed the required by-law permitting religious instruction, as specified above, to be offered by volunteers during designated half-hour per week classes.

Provincial and divisional guidelines will be followed. These guidelines are available from the school office, the divisional administration offices, or on the web site at www.hsd.ca.

Only children of parents who have signed or joined the petition may participate. Parents may join the petition by forwarding a signed note to the Board of Trustees of the Hanover School Division (forward to Southwood School), indicating the name and the grade of the students they are signing for.

Practice of Religion in Hanover School Division

As a Manitoba public school division, The Hanover School Division is obligated to comply with the provisions of *The Public Schools Act* and provincial guidelines governing the implementation of religious exercises and religious instruction. *The Public Schools Act* states that public schools must be non-sectarian. Religious exercises and religious instruction in public schools may only be implemented by school boards in a manner consistent with the Act and departmental guidelines after a parent petition is presented to the school board. Petitions must be submitted annually. The Hanover School Division will continue to provide for appropriate religious exercises and instruction consistent with provincial and divisional guidelines.

Southwood School a “Nut Aware School”

We are a ‘Nut Aware’ school



At Southwood School we are committed to provide a safe environment that is inclusive for all children. In common with most other schools, we have a number of children with nut allergies. The purpose of this page is to give families the information they need to support us in providing a safe and inclusive school.

Why ‘Nut Aware’? Southwood School is ‘Nut Aware’. We do not describe the school as being ‘Nut Free’ because we can’t guarantee that students or adults have not brought nuts, or traces of nuts, into the building.

What is Anaphylaxis? Anaphylaxis is a serious allergic reaction that can be life threatening. Approximately 1-2% of Canadians live with the risk of an anaphylactic reaction. Food allergies are the most common cause of anaphylaxis. The most common food allergens are peanuts, tree nuts, seafood, egg and milk products. Anaphylaxis can affect multiple body systems. This can range from skin inflammation to anaphylactic shock, which is an explosive over-reaction of the body’s immune system. This can be characterized by swelling, difficulty breathing, abdominal cramps, circulatory collapse, coma and, ultimately, death.

Southwood School staff receive training and information related to many life threatening conditions common to our community. These conditions include anaphylaxis, seizure disorders, and diabetes. Students with life threatening conditions have URIS (health care) plans outlining their condition and the safety procedures required of school staff members in the event of an emergency. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the school.

MediAlert’s No Child Without Program at Southwood

The No Child *Without* program offers a free MediAlert membership to students who attend our school and are between the ages of 4 up to their 14th birthday. If your child has a medical condition, allergy or is required to take medication on a regular basis then you should consider a MediAlert membership through this program.

Your child’s voice in an emergency, MediAlert membership - Gives emergency first responders immediate access to your child’s medical information on their MediAlert bracelet or necklet; Enables first responders to quickly obtain up to date medical information by means of the child’s Electronic Health Record through the 24 Hour Emergency Hotline; Communicates with the parent or emergency contact upon activation of the Hotline;

Allows free updates of the child’s medical record as needed.

MediAlert identification can alert school staff, friends, coaches and others about your child’s medical condition should an emergency occur.
